To do this we are focusing our delivery of work around three themes: People, Peers and Places.

This means that we will continue our work with young Londoners and their families, but will also expand this out to their peer networks, as well as working directly with the places where they live and spend their time.

We will expand our prevention work in education settings and communities, deliver more one on one support, and will provide a platform for young Londoners to fundamentally shape what we do, ensuring that their expertise is central to the solution.

Too often the responsibility for society's problems is laid at the feet of the young. This is not right – for too long we have been creating a narrative in which young people are positioned as the problem, whereas in fact the real problem is the context which we as a society have created and within which our children are attempting to grow and thrive.

Our strategy, which aims to change this, is ambitious and rightly so, but we know that we will achieve our vision with the support of our Trustees, staff, volunteers, commissioners and donors. We're looking forward to embarking on this journey together.

The issues in London are complex. One thing is clear - we must listen to young Londoners and include them in conversations. They must be part of the solution and not be seen as the problem.

We asked the young Londoners we work with to tell us what the issues in London are from their perspectives.

I feel like there's enough opportunities, but they're not the right opportunities. The older generations created opportunities, but it's not what us young people like. The older generation are tying to raise us in their own way - how they were brought up. This is a new generation, so everything has changed

I don't really feel like we're listened to. Are voices aren't heard. All the time media and the police are telling us what the problems are and the reasons for the problems. But if you came down to our neighbours and asked us what the reason are, I think we would give a completely different answer. I feel like we need more voices of kids that are actually growing up in the situation. The youth are the ones that need to be heard as they are the ones going through it.

In my opinion I believe it's violence, such as knife crime. Loads of young people are dying for stupid reasons such as postcode wars. Silly things that could just be stopped.

Housing. I've seen a rapid industrialisation and urbanisation where I live. You can see the disparity in the quality of housing.



THE NEXT FIVE YEARS

Over the next five years we will work collaboratively with young Londoners, involving them in the shaping of our services and providing a platform for their voices to be heard.

Working alongside young Londoners, their families and communities, we'll share our knowledge and expertise allowing them to identify their strengths and abilities.

OUR STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES: PEOPLE - YOUNG LONDONERS & FAMILIES



Young Londoners are full of ambition and aspiration. But too many of them today are living in a world that presents limited positive life opportunities.

Many of our programmes arose from the need identified across London for an organisation that could reach out to young people who live here. There was a need to help bridge them into the right support and develop the knowledge, skills and capability to have more agency in their lives.

Our support is centred around trusted relationships. our staff are relatable and credible. They work with young Londoners and the people important in their lives to deliver high quality, innovative and evidence based support.

OUR OBJECTIVES FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS: PEOPLE



Young Londoners and their families should have a single point of access to Safer London. We will develop a 'one front door' approach to taking referrals, helping us to better identify needs and trends.



We want one cohesive service for young Londoners. We will learn from each other and where something works, we will replicate it. In-house subject experts in areas such as housing and emotional wellbeing will ensure our team and all young Londoners can access specialist support.



We want to work in a trauma responsive way. Safer London will support our team to continually develop and create mechanisms for shared learning across the organisation.



Our services and delivery will be shaped by young Londoners. We will work with them to review, assess and develop our offer.

OUR STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES: PEERS - YOUNG LONDONERS & PEERS



In recent years there has been much more research around how the adolescent brain functions. This has started to provide the science which underpins how much young people are influenced by the views and actions of their peers.

This emerging evidence supports the observations of our own staff, that in some contexts messages delivered by peers are likely to have more influence than those delivered by professionals.

We work in education settings and communities with young Londoners to support and empower them to speak up, recognise, acknowledge, and call-out unacceptable behaviours. Our work with them can lead to an increased confidence and skill set to challenge their peers, professionals, communities and decision makers to positively shape and influence the world around them.

OUR OBJECTIVES FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS: PEERS



We will embed learning from research to make sure one-to-one support identifies and values the role of peers in safeguarding and support.



We want to be responsive to the needs of peer groups. We will develop and pilot new peer group interventions by empowering active bystanders to challenge attitudes, beliefs, and cultural norms.




We know the important role communities play in keeping young Londoners safe. We want to explore how we can deliver peer-to-peer support embedded in local communities.



Young Londoners must influence the work we do. We will build pathways so that those who have used our services can progress into roles which influence delivery, development and decision making.

OUR STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES: PLACES - HOUSING & COMMUNITIES



The places where young Londoners spend their time impacts on their safety, whether this is where they live, where they spend their leisure time, their school/education setting, the businesses they visit, or the ways that they travel around the city and beyond.

Contextual safeguarding is an approch based on developing an understanding and response to young people's experiences of significant harm beyond their families.

This recognises that the different relationships that young people form in their neighbourhoods, peer groups, schools and online can feature violence and abuse. This makes the approach relevant to all of our work.

OUR OBJECTIVES FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS: PLACES



Young Londoners and their families should feel safe in their homes. We will work with families, housing providers and community partners to make this a reality for more people. Where the only option is to move, we will help secure accommodation and ensure resettlement support is in place



We want the places where young Londoners spend their time to be safe. We will work with partners including academic experts and community stakeholders to make this happen. Using contextual safeguarding approaches, we will have a model for referring unsafe places and develop a range of effective interventions.



Through training and knowledge sharing we went to empower individuals and groups to keep themselves and their communities safe. We will work with partners to develop effective ways to keep young Londoners safe in the places they live their lives.



We want to work in partnership with community and faith organisations who demonstrate generous leadership to build sustainable capacity. Support will grow real local responses to violence and exploitation that are identity and trauma informed.

Alongside this we will implement a new case recording system to improve our ability to learn from the data we collect about the interactions we have with young Londoners and their families.

By designing, testing and establishing a long-term data capture and measurement approach, we'll seek to be as intelligent as we can about the impact of our work.
