
Safer London Bootcamp report 2022

summary

As our kick-start Bootcamp to bring the young champions alongside our existing VIPs our first objective was to bring the team together through team building, games and all-around fun!

Our first workshop centred around the role and its link to Safer London. The young Londoners were asked to explore personas, one for London; if the city was a person what would they be like and the second personas for the young champion role, what characteristics should they have, what they currently bring to the role and what can we build on. Following this, we explored what they currently liked about Safer London, what they didn't like and what they would like to see developed. This gave us great insight into our next steps and how the young representatives feel.

The workshop on the second day dived more towards the social media for LDN_Voices, developed originally by young Londoners of safer London to support other young Londoners. In this workshop, we looked at their initial opinions on a scale followed by what content would like to see, what they would like to be involved in and actions toward how we can develop this into our programme, supported by Kate, the Safer London digital comms officer.
